Dear Reader:

The Mountain City Ranger District is proposing the 76 Creek Abandoned Mine Closure Project. This project is located within the 76 Creek watershed north of Charleston in Elko County, Nevada. See attached map.

Within the project area there are four historic abandoned mine openings that are a public safety hazard. The Forest Service, in cooperation with the Nevada Division of Minerals, is proposing to close these openings to provide for public safety. Methods used to close these openings would involve the use of foam plugs and metal gates.

The Forest Service will be conducting an analysis of this proposal prior to making a decision on whether or not to approve the project. As part of this analysis we are inviting public comment on the project at this time. Soliciting public comments is required for all Forest Service proposed actions, including those that may be categorically excluded from further analysis and documentation in an Environmental Impact Statement Environmental Assessment. Internal scoping indicates that this project meets the requirements under Category 8 – *Short term (1 year or less) mineral, energy, or geophysical investigations and their incidental support activities that may require cross-country travel by vehicles and equipment, construction of less than 1 mile of low standard road, or use and minor repair of existing roads.* (36 CFR 220.6(e) (8))

The Advisory Council on Historic Preservation encourages agencies to coordinate the review of impacts to heritage resources as required under the National Historic Preservation Act with reviews required under the National Environmental Policy Act. Regulations (36 CFR, part 800) concerning protection and preservation of historic and pre-historic properties give the public, local governments, and other entities opportunities to participate in the review and evaluation of effects to cultural sites.

This review and evaluation is referred to as the Section 106 process, because it refers to section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act. In addition to seeking comments about historic and pre-historic sites, certain individuals and organizations with a demonstrated interest in the undertaking may participate as consulting parties in the Section 106 process. The Forest Service shall consider all written requests to participate as a consulting party.


