

# Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest offering off-highway vehicle grants

**SPARKS** — The Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest is developing an application for Off Highway Vehicle (OHV) Cooperative Funds for the upcoming 2011/2012 grant cycle. Forest staffs are developing a preliminary application to the Off Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation (OHMVR) Division, which includes a strong emphasis on OHV area management, restoration of trails and impacted areas, and law enforcement across the California lands of the Carson and Bridgeport Ranger Districts. The Forest is applying for the following three grants: Ground Operations, Law Enforcement, and Restoration.

The grant applications will be posted on the OHMVR website on March 6, 2012. Submitted grant applications may be reviewed by clicking on this link or pasting it into your browser: <http://www.ohv.parks.ca.gov>.

Public review-and-comment period for the 2011/2012 Grants and Cooperative Agreement Program begins on March 6, 2012, and ends on April 2, 2012. This period provides an opportunity for the public to review the preliminary applications submitted to the OHMVR Division for consideration during the current grant cycle.
