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COMMUNITY MEETING DISCUSSES ROAD WORK PROJECTS FOR MOUNT ROSE HIGHWAY, STATE ROUTE 28

Public meeting Thursday, March 29, 5:30 p.m., The Chateau at Incline Village

INCLINE VILLAGE, Nev. (March 22, 2012) – Q&D Construction and the Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) host a community meeting Thursday, March 29 at 5:30 p.m. at The Chateau at Incline Village to discuss road work projects scheduled to begin April 1. The project includes erosion control improvements from the summit of SR431 to the intersection of SR28 and from the same intersection northwest to Crystal Bay, Nev., along with construction of a roundabout at the intersection of SR431.

The erosion control work being performed on state Routes 431 and 28 is designed to capture storm water runoff and filter out sediment before it reaches Lake Tahoe, improving the Lake's clarity and cleanliness. The installation of a roundabout at the SR431/SR28 intersection is aimed at improving safety for all those on the road while easing congestion during peak traffic periods.

The Chateau at Incline Village is located at 955 Fairway Blvd. at the Championship Golf Course. Representatives from the NDOT and Q&D Construction will be present during the public meeting, which begins with an overview of the construction plans and schedules followed by a question and answer session. Light refreshments will be served.

"Our goal is to ensure that the community is informed and aware of everything that is going on in regard to this project," said Q&D Construction Project Manager Brian Graham. "We look forward to presenting the details of the projects and addressing all questions or concerns."
