The Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest, Carson Ranger District is seeking comments on the proposed Marlette Pipeline Replacement, Sawmill Pipeline to Lakeview Tank southwest of Washoe Valley on Franktown Creek Road near Lakeview Nevada. The project is within Carson City and Washoe County.

### **Comments and Timeframe**

The Forest Service encourages your comments on this Project. Written, facsimile, hand-delivered, oral, and electronic comments concerning this action will be accepted for 30 calendar days following the publication of the legal notice for this project in the Reno Gazette Journal. It is the responsibility of persons providing comments to submit them by the close of the comment period. Interest expressed or comments provided after the close of the 30-day comment period will be considered, but will not confer eligibility to appeal a decision to proceed with the Project.

### **Proposed Action**

The Forest Service proposes to authorize the construction, operation and maintenance of a 24 inch water transmission pipeline crossing NFS lands for approximately 766 feet in length. The pipeline would be placed in a 10 foot right of way within previously disturbed portions of Franktown Creek Road. The existing pipeline 18 inches in diameter would remain abandoned in place.
