FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT DRINKING WATER STATE REVOLVING FUND

The Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) in Sections 445A.6758 to 445A.67612, inclusive, outlines the environmental review procedures to be followed by the Division of Environmental Protection (NDEP) to meet the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act. In accordance with these procedures, NDEP intends to issue a finding of no significant impact (FONSI) for the Kingston Town Water Utilities water project. The project will utilize funds from the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund.

Project Name: New Water Storage Tank

Project No: 40 - Year 2015 Priority List

Applicant: Kingston Town Water Utilities

Total Estimated Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Assistance: \$441,000

The Town of Kingston is located in Lander County approximately 28 miles south of Austin. This project will consist of demolishing three existing, 20,000-gallon, glass-lined tanks (offline since 2003) and installing a new 185,000-gallon, welded-steel tank on the site along with necessary site preparation and appurtenances.

The NACs allow NDEP to utilize an environmental review (ER) conducted for another agency as long as the review complies with NDEP's environmental requirements. In 2014, an application for funding for this project was made to the US Department of Housing & Urban Development, Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program, and an ER was required as a part of the CDBG application. The ER provided documentation of consultation with federal and state environmental regulatory and natural resource agencies. NDEP reviewed the ER and agency correspondence and determined that no further environmental review is recommended and the project is eligible for a FONSI because it is unlikely to have a negative effect on the quality of the environment. The proposed improvements will be constructed on property owned by the water utility. Best management practices will be utilized during construction. The project will have a beneficial effect by ensuring the customers receive water that is reliable and safe to drink.
