
Goldfield Material Site ES 03-08 Expansion Esmeralda County US 95 Milepost ES 8.8

PURPOSE OF NOTICE: The Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT), in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), is preparing an Environmental Assessment (EA) to analyze a proposal to expand an existing material site, ES 03-08, by 140 acres on BLM-administered land.

The 140-acre expansion area is located about 10 miles south of Goldfield on the west side of US 95, at Milepost ES 8.8, Esmeralda County. The lands are administered by the BLM Tonopah Field Office.

WHY: Material source sites are necessary for the construction and long-term maintenance of highways. This proposed expansion area contains material meeting highway construction and maintenance requirements. The site would be used by NDOT and their contractors to perform highway construction and maintenance on all federal-aid highways in the vicinity. The BLM's purpose in considering approval of this action is to assure it is a legitimate use of public lands. Legitimate uses are those that are authorized under the Federal Land Policy and Management Act (FLPMA) of 1976, and current BLM policies, plans and programs, while preventing undue and unnecessary degradation to the land.
